### **Opening**

President Abby Gitlitz called the meeting to order at 2:01 p.m.

Reverends Grant and Leite lit the chalice and delivered the opening words.

Vice President Abby Gitlitz provided guidelines for the meeting.

President Gitlitz introduced Parliamentarian Steve Dillon.

### **Lead Minister Report**

Reverend Connie Grant summarized the projects and goals UUCB staff have been working over the past six months:

- 1. Staff restructuring
- 2. Review of church by-laws and revisions
- 3. Decision not to hire a second minister
- 4. Created Director of Administrations position
- 5. Increased hours of the Administrative Assistant and Administrative Coordinator
- 6. Created new position for Technology Coordinator
- 7. Eliminated the position of Minister of Story and Ritual

The Church by-laws are being revised by Stuart Yoak, Marg Craig and Steve Dillon. The goal is to update and streamline them as the old governance model was not effective for UUCB.

Reverend Emily Leite – Minister of Story and Ritual. Further farewell festivities are planned for June 18.

### **Minister of Story and Ritual Report**

This year Reverend Leite focused on four areas and then can be reviewed in the attached report. Reverend Leite summarized what she has learned about the UUCB Congregation.

- 1. UUCB Plays together as a congregation
- 2. Congregants are open to holy reverence
- 3. UUCB is a justice seeking congregation
- 4. UUCB asked to learn more about indigenous people
- 5. UUCB Congregants built houses, fed the hungry and visited the incarcerated
- 6. UUCB shared joy in music
- 7. UUCB honors our beloved community through commissioned performances.
- 8. UUCB is an open-hearted community
- 9. UUCB celebrated and mourned together

Reverend Leite closed by saying that she made mistakes, learned together and loved offering support and mentoring to the children and youth of the congregation.

### **Technology Coordinator Report**

Hans Kelson summarized his job responsibilities as the Technology Coordinator

- 1. Set up and maintain Sunday service livestream
- 2. Conduct all AV work for the congregation
- 3. Develop slides for services and other events
- 4. Edit and test video as needed
- 5. Organize and archive files
- 6. Provide IT support to the staff
- 7. Maintain multimedia systems

Hans Kelson announced that he is rebuilding the UUCB website and is currently being rolled out. The new website can be found at new.uubloomington.org

Topics are aligned with the UUA organization and is integrated with UUCB systems. The website has a list of upcoming events and is synced with the Church Planning Center. The website is designed to be consistent and up-to-date. The order of service can easily be viewed on a phone and it follows the web content accessibility standards.

### **Director of Religious Education Support**

Stephanie Kimball opened her report discussing how Religious Education (RE) is the place where we keep questions alive through spirituality, truth, questions, and reflection.

Stephanie summarized the strong interest in Adult RE:

- 1. Spiritual Deepening
- 2. Dismantling White Supremacy
- 3. UU Identity, Theology and History
- 4. Social Justice (RE is partnering with the Social Justice Committee)
- 5. Adult Our Whole Lives (OWL) class

Next year Adult RE will build on these themes and the new schedule will be available in August.

Stephanie summarized the status of the RE program for children. Families have not been returning in great numbers post COVID, consequently the program is having a hard time finding adult volunteers. They are experimenting with adding short courses at alternate times from the service. In addition, a youth library is being established. The OWL program has been caught up from the pandemic disruption and the Coming of Age program and Youth program are currently in action.

Next year there will be new RE support positions integrated into the RE support staff, a new indigenous studies working group will be established along with a Youth Empowerment Program.

### **Committee and Task Force Updates**

#### **Planned Giving Report**

Ann Kamman described the planned giving group as approximately 90-100 congregants who have made arrangements in advance to provide to the church, also known as the legacy circle. This is a sign of congregational health. The celebration of the Legacy Circle will be in September.

Andrew Appel described the objective of the committee is to support charitable activities. This fund is not part of the church's operating budget and funds original music composition, HVAC in the RE building and will provide fall Social Justice grants. The committee will provide more visibility into their meeting minutes.

Andrew indicated that SPF has divested fossil fuel investments from Baird to Vanguard. There has been some growth from investments last year with about 9% in fossil fuel divested accounts. Andrew stated that if any program is not covered by the operating fund, then SPF will consider requests.

### **Quorum Report**

Board Member Jane McLeod reported 118 attendees, exceeding the 10%, of the total membership required to conduct business.
