We seek to reach out to marginalized people who have little voice or people who advocate for them, and who are currently or have been incarcerated. Once we connect, we provide support where needed.

2. What are your planned **activities** this year **(especially thinking of families, children, chalice circles, and connections)**, including fundraising and educational meetings, and how do you plan to accomplish them?

Planned activities:

- a. KAP will continue to provide activities and are supporting some of the caregiver as they become leaders; continue to meet with children and caregivers for activities on a monthly basis; raise more funds for kids to attend summer camp.
- b. Continue to connect with Amethyst House and Courage to Change to provide mini-sessions to people living there; ask other UUs to volunteer
- c. Do a quarterly request for inmate complaints from MOCO; notify County Council of issues; write LTE when specific changes need to be made; create line of communication with newly elected Sheriff in November.
- d. Provide funds to Phillip Stroud to continue Hope for Prisoners group inside Pendleton Correctional Facility
- e. Seek ways to donate money to an inmate's commissary or phone account so they can connect with loved ones expanding to the Women's Prison.
- f. Make phone calls to IDOC or specific prisons when IDOC WATCH has requests
- g. Book study of Defund Fear by Zach Norris for adult RE.
- h. Plan a way to showcase the many artistic talents of incarcerated persons and others that are part of all of our task forces.
- i. Share the work of our task force with elementary students in RE.
- 3. Who are the **members** of this task force, and what is the normal schedule of your meetings? Do you have plans to expand within the congregation and to the larger community?
