

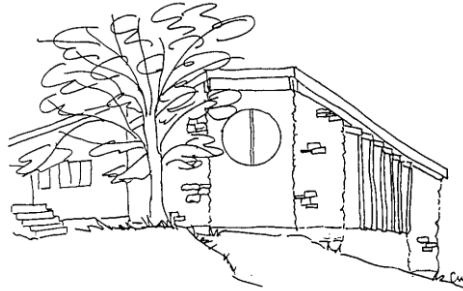

## Earth Tip-- Energy Saving for Winter

- Set your water heater to 120°.

- Open drapes on south-facing windows to warm your home. Consider closing drapes in rooms that receive no direct sunlight to insulate from cold window drafts.
- Start by setting your thermostat to 68°.
- If you have a clothes washing machine, use cold water.
- Replace your furnace or heat pump filter regularly.
- Install a programmable thermostat.
- Install low-flow showerheads and faucets.

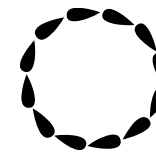
