

MAM's Meanderings

In the worship service on September 13, Paul Lane and I addressed the topics of spiritual eldering, age and aging. During the sermon, I announced that our Elder Focus Task Force will be offering a "Nursing Home Visits 101" workshop on October 3rd from 10:00am to 11:30am in our church library. Clarke Miller (former Nursing Home Administrator) and I will facilitate this workshop as a means to educate, support and encourage those who might be interested in making visits to our congregation members who are in nursing homes. We hope that those who are already making such visits will also join us, so we can share together the rewards and challenges of this ministry. As I said in my sermon, "Visiting a nursing home is not an easy task; some of the the harshness of aging is hidden away in these facilities." Our society, akin to the aims of young Siddhartha's father, often isolates those who are ill or aging from our view.

When I asked one of our regular nursing home visitors why she kept a visit to the nursing home as a regular practice despite her busy schedule, Kathy Sideli replied, "Even when caring for my husband Dan at home, that one hour a week has always been a cherished one for me, since it helps me focus on how people need to feel valued up until the end, and how we must make time for them. And I saw how much visitors meant to Dan when they were his main contact with the world." 
