Hoosier Interfaith Power and Light



49th out of 50. <u>49th out of 50!?</u> According to Forbes magazine, this is where Indiana ranks in terms of its status as a Green state. We are at the bottom of the barrel; Hoosiers have the 6th highest greenhouse gas emissions in the United States from burning fossil fuels. The news of our ponds, lakes and waterways is equally as startling with pollutants such as E-Coli and mercury silently collecting in our streams. Sobering facts indeed. However, they were received in the context of a large interfaith gathering in

Indianapolis last Saturday where leaders and members of faith communities throughout Indiana gathered to inspire and equip one another to sacredly care for this spinning blue green planet we call home.

This interfaith event launched *Hoosier Interfaith Power and Light,* which is a nationwide religious movement which brings together people of faith as stewards of creation in order to promote energy conservation, energy efficiency, renewable energy and related sustainable practices. Indiana is the 38th state to join! We can have some joy that we are not 49th in this ranking!

Several members of our congregation attended this launch. One of three programs highlighted was the "Task of the Month" congregational toolkit created by Unitarian Universalist Church of Bloomington member, Stephanie Kimball. Our congregation's engagement of this energy reduction toolkit, which is housed in a pizza box, was highlighted throughout the gathering. Reverend Macklin saw one man leaving with FIVE pizza boxes (Task of the Month toolkits). "Where are you going?" she asked him. "Back to Muncie!" he said, "I am going to distribute this to five different congregations!" It is a good beginning.



Indiana Equality Call For Action March 14

As ministers serving a Welcoming Congregation, we are disturbed that our Indiana House of Representatives recently voted to forward HJR-6 to the Senate. HJR-6 is a proposal to ban same-gender marriage, civil unions, and other "substantially similar" rights for those in same-sex relationships.

This is a serious attack on equality.

As ministers, we plan to attend a rally which will take place on Monday, March 14th at noon on the south steps of the Indiana State House (200 W. Washington Street). It will be an opportunity to tell our State legislators and all of Indiana that we Unitarian Universalists "Stand on the Side of Love". Using a programmable thermostat in your home is one of the easiest ways to save energy, money, and help fight global warming with a savings of about \$180 annually.

If you are not inclined to install one yourself and can afford it, have your furnace inspector or contractor install a programmable thermostat for you. Another option is to "program" yourself to use your thermostat settings optimally. In cold months, experiment with lowering your settings during waking hours at home and decreasing them much further when asleep or out of the house.
