





## Banned Books Among Us

During the November 16 Age of Reason service on books, we also found out that we have several authors from our congregation who have made the coveted banned book list:

Elizabeth Lion and her book, "Human Sexuality in Nursing Process (John Wiley and Sons, 1982). The book was written for nurses and health care practitioners to help them integrate the role of human sexuality within overall health care. Elizabeth discovered her book at a 'banned book' display at the Indiana University main library. Elizabeth's daughter believes that her mother's inclusion in the banned book group is one of her crowning achievements.

Noretta Koertge says the following about her book, "When I visited a gay bookstore in London in the early eighties I was pleased to see a copy of my coming-of-age novel "Who Was That Masked Woman?" on the shelf. The clerk told me that it had arrived recently in a courier's luggage. The British import authorities were confiscating shipments of

gay books from the US so the store was now using "informal" delivery methods."




